Call to Order by Mayor Adam Rabe at 6:00 p.m. on May 10, 2023. Council Officials Present: Matt Fults, Sue Peterson, Bill Kreis, John Hinshaw (via phone), Travis Schlabach. Absent: None. Quorum declared by Rabe.

Approval of minutes from April 26, 2023 City Council Meeting. Claims, checks and direct withdrawals totaling \$152,792.40. April 2023 Revenues Totaling \$828,499.65. Open Forum

D. McCausland provided update on Vestas facilities located at 2273 Highway 6 Trl, as hopper structure was destroyed during weekend storm and estimated 80 mph winds. Reported constructing single level of containers. Inquired on council's consideration for adding bales of hay on top of containers for additional height. Rabe stated council prohibited stacking containers due to ascetics, and stacking of hay bales would fall into same category. D. Kinzenbaw suggested council consideration for alternative specifications, and provided estimated costs, for the Public Works Shop 2" Water Main; 6" Water Main; and 6" Sewer RFPs that were due for submission to city hall by May 8, 2023.

 Modifying Provisions of Ordinance 434, the City of Marengo Natural Gas Franchise, Relating to Franchise Fees
 Public hearing opened at 6:08 p.m. No comments. Public hearing closed at 6:09 p.m. Motion by Schlabach to approve.
 Second by Peterson. Roll Call Vote. Ayes: Fults, Peterson, Kreis, Hinshaw, Schlabach. Nays: None. Motion Carried.
- c) Public Hearing and First Reading ORD #516: Amendment to Chapter 69 Parking Regulations Amending Section 69.11 LIMITED PARKING, Adding to item #3-Two Hour Limited Parking from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Washington Street on the North Side from 90 feet East of Marengo Avenue
 - Public hearing opened at 6:10 p.m. Gray clarified that change is to add two-hour limited parking on Washington Street and to remove items #1 and #2 from existing ordinance, which renumbers ordinance for inclusion of an item #1 and an item #2 only. No public comments. Public hearing closed at 6:12 p.m. Motion by Schlabach to approve the amending of section 69.11 Limited Parking, adding Two Hour Limited Parking from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Washington Street on the North Side from 90 Feet East of Marengo Avenue and removing current items #1 and #2. Second by Kreis. Roll Call Vote. Ayes: Fults, Peterson, Kreis, Hinshaw, Schlabach. Nays: None. Motion Carried.
- d) Resolution #23-68: Acceptance of Proposals to Install 2" or 6" Water Services and 6" Sewer Services as part of Proposed Urban Renewal Project for Relocation of Public Works Building to City's Industrial Park, Lot #2

 Discussions occurred regarding prior council discussions and decisions specific to relocation of public works building, and the requested RFPs alignment with those decisions. Marck noted resolution includes stipulation that contracting of services with lowest bidder is contingent upon receipt of financing for the relocation of the public works building to Lot #2 of the city's Industrial Park. Motion by Schlabach to approve resolution option #2, which includes 6" Water Main and 6" Sewer. Second by Hinshaw. Roll Call Vote. Ayes: Fults, Kreis, Hinshaw, Schlabach. Nays: Peterson. Motion Carried.
- e) Resolution #23-69: Setting Public Hearing for Subdivision of Lot #2; Reserving Northern Section for City's Use
 Discussions occurred on need to adjust resolution subdivision descriptions for inclusion of property located on north side of
 drainage ditch easement and for adding north/south utilities easement through proposed southern segment. Motion by
 Schlabach to set public hearing for subdivision of lot #2, into 3 segments, with the southern property line of the northern most
 segment to run through the center of the drainage ditch easement and to be sold with the 1.45 acre parcel located on the
 southern section of lot #2, which is to include a utility easement within the site 25' setback area, from Dillin Street to the
 southern border of the north 1.25 acre parcel. Second by Kreis. Roll Call Vote. Ayes: Fults, Kreis, Hinshaw, Schlabach.

<u>Update Public Safety - Chief Ben Gray</u>

For April 2023, Gray reported 34 incidents, 15 arrests, 49 citations, 63 warnings, 18 parking tickets, with a total of 48 outstanding parking tickets. There were 382 calls for service. Reported Officer Botsford will be returning to academy, as required, to finalize certification. National Police Week begins May 14, 2023. A total of 12 nuisance property notices were served, 5 have been abated, one citation was issued. Iowa County Mental Health Liaison reported a total of 136.1 CFS response hours.

Kensler reported Ruiz judgment was received and city awarded reimbursement.
